The Voice of Faith

Dear Faith Family,

One of the resources I regularly consult is put out by the United Church of Canada entitled "Gathering - Resources for Worship Planners". The United Church of Canada calls this season "Creation Time". Creation Time begins on September 10 and ends on the Sunday before Advent. I am curious about this description of this time of year, in part, because I typically think of fall as a time of harvest and the end of gardens and what we've created. In addition, our sermons this fall will come from the Hebrew Bible. On September 10, we will read the story of creation, but after that our stories will be about Abraham and Isaac, Jacob's ladder, the call of Moses, and Israelites complaining in the wilderness. These are stories about people who've messed up - how are these stories about creation?

These are difficult times for us...as a church and as a nation. I believe they are also times of reckoning: Who are we? What do we hold most dear? How have we failed to live as we are called to live? As such, perhaps we are asked to hold up a mirror to ourselves and be honest about who we are.

We can have the courage to reckon with ourselves, I think, because we believe in a God who used people like Abraham and Jacob and Moses and the people of Israel - none of whom were perfect; all of them messed up. God used people like us to do God's creative work in the world - the work of finding a new way, of making a people out of "no people", of deliverance from affliction. When we look at these stories in this way, maybe they are all about creation! Maybe this season is all about creation!

As we begin a new season, I invite you to commit to the difficult work of holding up the mirror, of examining ourselves and our nation. Our adult education classes this year will look at the issues of climate change, immigration, transgender sexuality, gun violence, issues facing Baltimore City and racism, among other topics. In October, we will be examining how we cope in stressful times. In February, we will look at racism. Perhaps, these classes will be a way of thinking hard about who we are.

Social & Environmental Justice Council

Several important social justice issues will be in the news in the coming months:

The paid sick leave bill (Healthy Working Families Act, HB 1) passed the Maryland General Assembly during its 2017 session but was vetoed by the governor. There may be enough votes to override the veto during the 2018 General Assembly session but supporters of the bill are not totally comfortable with the margin and are calling on citizens to lobby their delegates and senators to vote to override. The senators they are focusing their efforts on include primarily Senators Delores Kelly (Baltimore Co., District 10), Jim Mathias (Wicomico Co. District 38), and Shirley Nathan-Pulliam (Baltimore City, District 44). Secondary priorities will be Senators Nat Oaks (Baltimore City, 41), and Bobby Zirkin (Baltimore Co., 11). Delegates who need encouragement to support the bill include Pam Beidle and Mark Chang (Anne Arundel Co., District 32), and Mary Ann Lisanti (Harford Co., District 34). If you live in any of those districts, please encouraging your representative him/her to support the bill.

The Consent Decree between the Baltimore City Police Department and the Department of Justice was approved by a federal judge after the DOJ of the new administration had attempted to delay its implementation. The consent decree is a court enforceable agreement to resolve DOJ's findings, in the wake of the Freddie Gray incident, that the Baltimore City

Police Department (BPD) had engaged in a pattern and practice of conduct that violates the First, Fourth, and Fourteenth Amendments to the Constitution, and certain provisions of federal statutory law. Their report includes widespread racial bias, use of excessive force, repeated patterns of unconstitutional arrests and hostility towards women and LGBT civilians, as well as other civil rights violations. As of this writing, the selection of a monitor for the implementation of the consent decree is underway with community meetings giving citizens input on the four organizations, which are in the running for the job of monitor.

The 20/20 Vision for Fair Development in Baltimore was past by the citizens of Baltimore during last November's election. As described in a previous Voice of Faith article, the 20-20 plan would require the city to issue \$20 million in bonds to build permanently affordable housing and another \$20 million to create jobs deconstructing vacant houses and creating green spaces. The mayor has expressed her support for the measure as have a number of city council members including: Councilpersons John Bullock, District 9; Shannon Sneed, District 13; Sharon Middleton, District 6; Kristerfer Burnett, District 8; Bill Henry, District 4; Mary Pat Clarke, District 14; and Zeke Cohen, District 1. If you fall into one of the above districts, please express your appreciation to them; if you are in a different district, please urge your councilperson to throw his/her support behind the initiative. Art with a Heart



For four full weeks this summer, Faith Church's community hall was filled with incredible artwork and engaged youth thanks to HeARTworks, Art with a Heart's Workforce Development Program. With art as its vehicle, HeARTworks provides a safe space for vulnerable youth ages 14-24 to experience a collaborative work environment with the intention of increasing their job readiness and life skills. Participants work on creating marketable art for HeARTwares, Art with a Heart's retail store and social enterprise, located at 623 W. 34th Street, Baltimore, MD 21211.



Thirteen participants were recruited from the surrounding neighborhoods for Faith Church's third summer of hosting the program. They worked diligently on a variety of marketable art projects: from colorful pop art trashcans and decorative birdhouses, to crazy fun fish created with recycled materials and plaster. Koli Tengella, Art with a Heart's HeARTworks Teacher, brought a new

element to the program: Theatre! The weekly job readiness workshops became a mixture of spoken word and performing arts, emphasizing the importance of public speaking, self-branding, and communication in the workplace. Participants collaborated on a 20-minute performance that they debuted during graduation that included acting, singing, dancing, and sketch comedy. Subject matter included civil rights, justice, addressing homelessness, identity, interviewing, and even phone usage!



When asked what they learned so far, participants responded with "financial literacy, time management, teamwork, communicating with co-workers, public speaking, and art skills." One youth said that she learned to "be yourself, be focused, and be ready!" The sense of pride and accomplishment can be felt in both their words and artwork. Art with a Heart is happy to report that during our annual summer celebration, Shop & Bop (which took place on August 4th), participants from all across our HeARTworks programs sold over 120 items! As part of Art with a Heart's community commitment, half of the sales proceeds are split between Art with a Heart and the community partner. Art with a Heart is incredibly grateful for Faith Church's partnership in this endeavor and we hope that you check out the youth's artwork at HeARTwares, especially during the upcoming holiday season!

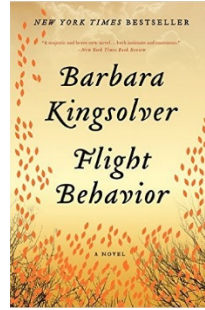

Book Club



We have selected *The Flight Behavior* by **Barbara Kingsolver** for our September gathering.

Flight Behavior is a brilliant and suspenseful novel, by a Pulitzer Prize winning author, set in present day Appalachia; a breathtaking parable of catastrophe and denial that explores how the complexities we inevitably encounter in life lead us to believe in our particular chosen truths.

Kingsolver's riveting story concerns a young wife and mother on a failing farm in rural Tennessee who experiences something she cannot explain, and how her discovery energizes various competing factions—religious leaders, climate scientists, environmentalists, politicians—trapping her in the center of the conflict and ultimately opening up her world. *Flight Behavior* is arguably Kingsolver's most thrilling and accessible novel to date, and like so many other of her acclaimed works, represents contemporary American fiction at its finest.
